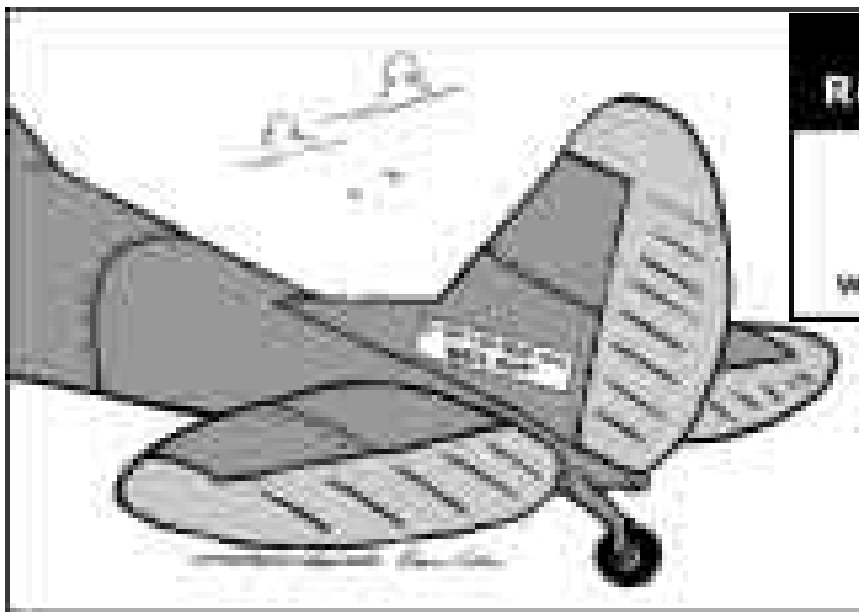

Safe Use Of The Mt. Diablo Practice Area

With a lot of us using the Mt Diablo practice area and Peter's failed fuel injector line it made me think how I approach flying in the area, where I fly and how I manage the airspace around me safely. These are a few thoughts

- Before flying in the area look at a sectional and a normal map and understand the "size" of the area and the location / name of any key landmarks.
- Know the area you like to practice over With the map and sectional understand general shape of the area, where the flat area's are, road layout, pylons etc. At the end of one practice flight when you are at the bottom of your "box" drop down to 1000 ft agl, slow it down and overfly the area you normally use. Look at the ground layout, how flat is the land, where would make a good emergency landing field, where are the obstacles etc. There are some good flat area's in the two valleys running approx North-South directly West of the Roddy Ranch Gold Course Do you have any idea where this is?
- Always fly with a cell phone and some money. If you need to ask why, it's maybe best you stop flying.
- When making any call's start with the color and type of aircraft. Telling others the color of the plane helps with locating the aircraft e.g. "Red & White Pitts's 117 PS
- Make a call before entering the area saying where you are so that others in the area know another plane is intending to use the space, from which direction and altitude they are coming from.
- If you fly from Attitude and you see someone getting into a plane with a parachute on, wander over and politely ask them where they plan to fly / practice and come up with a basic plan so you both know where you plan fly. It's easier to formulate a plan on the ground and work it out between you than when in the air.
- While flying in the area make regular pro-active calls as to plane, location, altitude and intentions. Other pilot's sometimes forget to call!
- Occasionally switch frequency's to 123.15 and make a call on that frequency. A lot of the Livermore based "Warbird" pilot's use that frequency and use the area for dog-fight and aerobatic's as well. A pair of T-6's dog-fighting use's a lot of space and they do not use 122.75!
- Know which way Byron is and the CTAF ... 123.05. This is the closest airport to the area if you are in a partial power situation. If you suffer from the memory span of a

gnat try a getting a label maker and making a label for your panel.

- Call when you leave the area make a call stating stating, plane, location, altitude and direction of flight out of the area.
- Do not leave the same way you came in. Most LVK based pilot's exit the pattern on a right down-wind and fly direct to the area. When you come to leave the practice area head south and return via Los Vaqueros. This way you are following the rough general traffic pattern in the area.

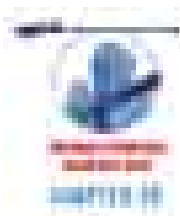
