Once again, the TAC members were very supportive of our attempts to renew the waiver, and even offered up that the Tracy City Council was equally supportive. They've put us on the calendar for their next meeting to take an official vote, and get it in the City records, that they unanimously support the renewal of the box. They're going to then forward this to the City Council and ask them to vote as well to add further official support to our efforts. In addition, while Don tirelessly has got-

ten the unanimous support of the gravel pits, Angie has been having back-and-forth discussions with the Oakland FSDO and is making progress on getting us to a place where we hope to have removed all of their issues. We also have Bill Finagin, from the National IAC, stepping up to help us through his connections with the FAA in Washington. Hopefully, all of this persistence will eventually pay off here over the coming months.

April was also a busy month with Allyson hosting her fundraiser to help her raise money for her trip to the World Aerobatic Competition and, judging from the money raised and the huge number of folks that turned out, it seemed to be a screaming success. See the pictures later in this newsletter for a more in-depth overview of the event. Chapter 38 was there in force so thanks to everyone for helping our Chapter live up to our aspirations, and for helping to make Allyson's trip a certainty. Great event, Allyson!

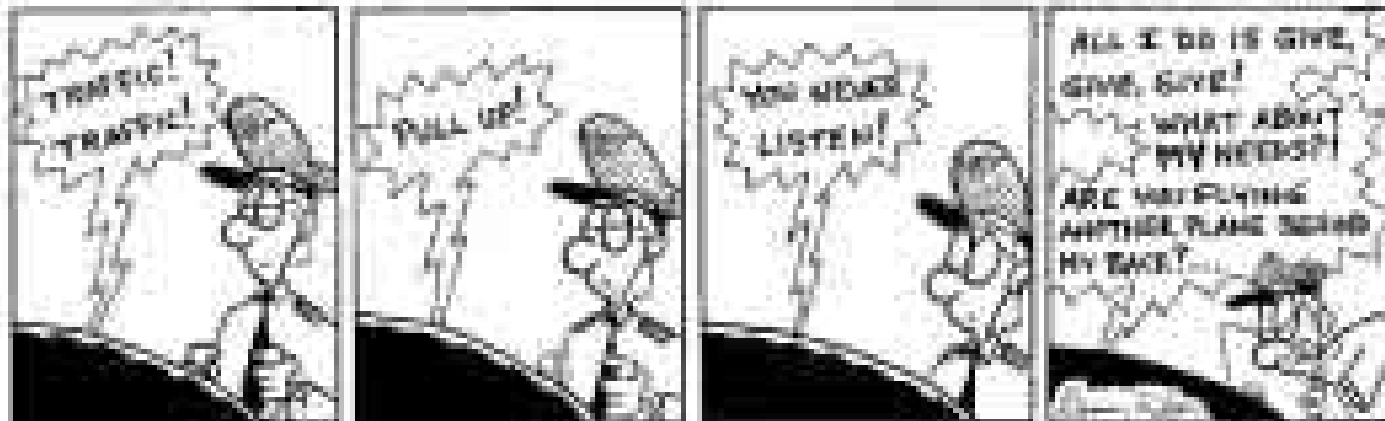

Down Mexico Way

Arriving at the airport at 5am, the wind and rain weren't going to stop my flight to San Jose Del Cabo, the large airport near Cabo San Lucas. It did slow it down a little though. The FBO was not going to pull the plane out of the hangar in 21G27 kt wind. I told them I was going anyway, so they relented and got the airplane on the ramp ½ hour later than planned.

Looking at the weather on the computer, it was showing weather in Northern California down to about Santa Barbara. There were the usual PIREPs for mountain obscuration. South of that was forecast blue skies and sunshine. At FL270 the winds were 258/66 – almost a direct crosswind, no loss, no gain. The flight Plan was IFR along the jet airways via Avenal, Los Angeles, San Diego, Tijuana, Loreto, and into Cabo. The 1120 nm route should take about 4 hrs.

As the passengers started showing up, I took their luggage and asked each if they had their passports. To cross the border you need to bring either your passport or a birth certificate and a driver's licence. While you may be able to get into Mexico without proper I.D. (and a little \$\$ to the right person), it is much harder crossing the border north bound. I double checked I had my passport and permanent resident card.

To fly a private aircraft into Mexico you need Mexican liability insurance. It is easily obtained from many companies, and I double checked I had a copy of that. You must also have the permanent C of R (no pink copy), C of A, and your pilot's licence.

The departure out of Sacramento went smoothly with only the

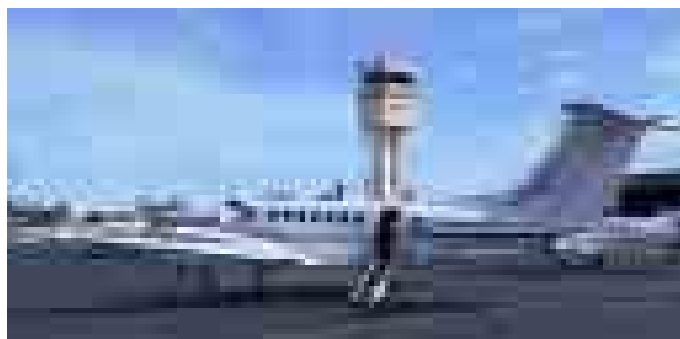
occasional bump as we climbed. I contact NorCal Departure for the initial climb. After levelling at 11,000 feet, I was told to contact Oakland Center. The climb to FL270 was interrupted numerous times levelling off for traffic. I had the other aircraft on the TCAS (Traffic Collision Avoidance) but not visual, I couldn't see because I was in cloud. Switching to L.A. Center, I could hear some airliners complaining of bumpy rides in the FL30s, but it was smooth at my altitude. Once crossing the border and switching to Mazatlan Center, the radio calls became a mixture of Spanish and English. All the local traffic was in Spanish with American registered aircraft using English. I took French in school, so the only Spanish I know is "cervaza".

Looking down at the Baja peninsula, you can see a lot of desolate landscape criss-crossed by dirt trails and small settlements. From altitude, I could see both the Sea of Cortez and the Pacific Ocean.

Landing in San Jose after 4 hours, ground speed averaged 280 kts, and I still had fuel for another 1 ½ hrs. There is no parallel taxiway at SJD so all aircraft must backtrack on the runway, which can slow down arrivals as you wait for the traffic to clear. Once off the runway, we taxied to the General Aviation ramp in the center of the airport between the two airline terminals.

Checking in with the airport commandante, I have to show all the required documents and he types up some paperwork. You pay the landing fee, and he stamps the paperwork. Next, Immigration will issue you a tourist permit and he will stamp your paperwork. You have to hold on to your tourist permit and return it when you depart the country. Customs makes you push a button that randomly lights up green or red. If it goes RED, you have your bags searched. If GREEN, you get another stamp on your paperwork and go to close your flight plan. The flight station personnel will close your flight plan and puts a stamp on your paperwork. Back to the commandante to show him everyone has stamped it, he signs it and you are good to go.

Out the front doors into the sun and heat, now you are on "Mexico Time"

The second flight was a near repeat of the first with Doug & Howard 1st & 3rd, with Yuichi slipping to 5th place. I was still bringing up the rear but failed dismally to fly any worse

and started a slow but steady crawl up the ratings to 3rd from last.

The third flight saw the team starting to tire, but Doug managed to stay strong and won the round again, with Yuichi slipping to 7th place. 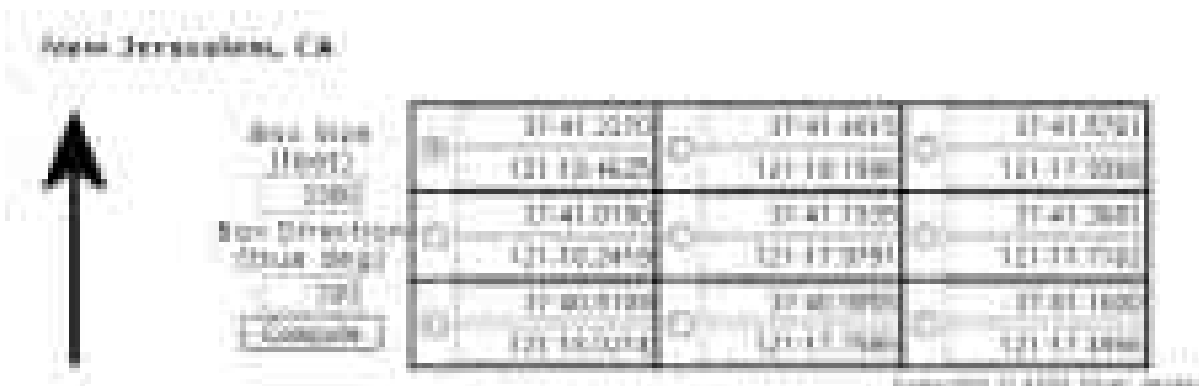
