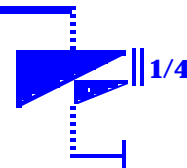

June Rihn

September 11, 1925 – August 19, 2002

June was the mother of Sally Campbell of Walnut Creek, Daniel Rihn of Long Beach and Margery James of Salt Lake City and devoted grandmother of Chrissy and Katie Campbell, Betsey and Andy Rihn, and Alyson James.

June was born in 1925 in Pittsfield, MA and was raised in Maine. She later went to nursing school in Boston where she met Richard, who was a medical student. They were married in 1949 and moved to California in 1951 where June, a registered nurse, assisted Richard in their medical practice.

June was a founder of the Acorn Branch of the East Bay Children's Hospital Auxiliary. As one of the early presidents she raised significant funds for charitable medical care for infants and children.

June was the 'power behind the throne' in local, national and international sport aerobatics. She was a tireless worker in all facets of the sport and was known to all as "Mama June". A nurse by profession she was a nurturing type by nature and earned the nickname "Mama" because she mothered all of those in need of mothering.



In 1996 she was honored by the International Aerobatic Club with one of its highest awards, the Frank Price Trophy. Equivalent to a lifetime achievement award, the Frank Price Trophy is awarded to those who have made outstanding contributions to the sport of aerobatics.

For forty-two years June was active at the First Presbyterian Church in Richmond as a Deacon. Upon moving to Pleasant Hill in 1994 June became a member of the Walnut Creek Presbyterian Church. She was also an active member and officer of the Order of the Eastern Star and an enthusiastic member of the American Sewing Guild. June enjoyed sewing useful and artistic accessories or garments for children and friends. She thoroughly enjoyed the gift of giving to others. Her most recent activity was to produce a dozen machine-embroidered Angels to appear in a large banner memorializing the loss of life of each of the victims of September 11, 2001 at the World Trade Towers.

June was known for her frequent and beautiful smile, but even more for her kindness and benevolence. She always offered a helping hand to friends and acquaintances.

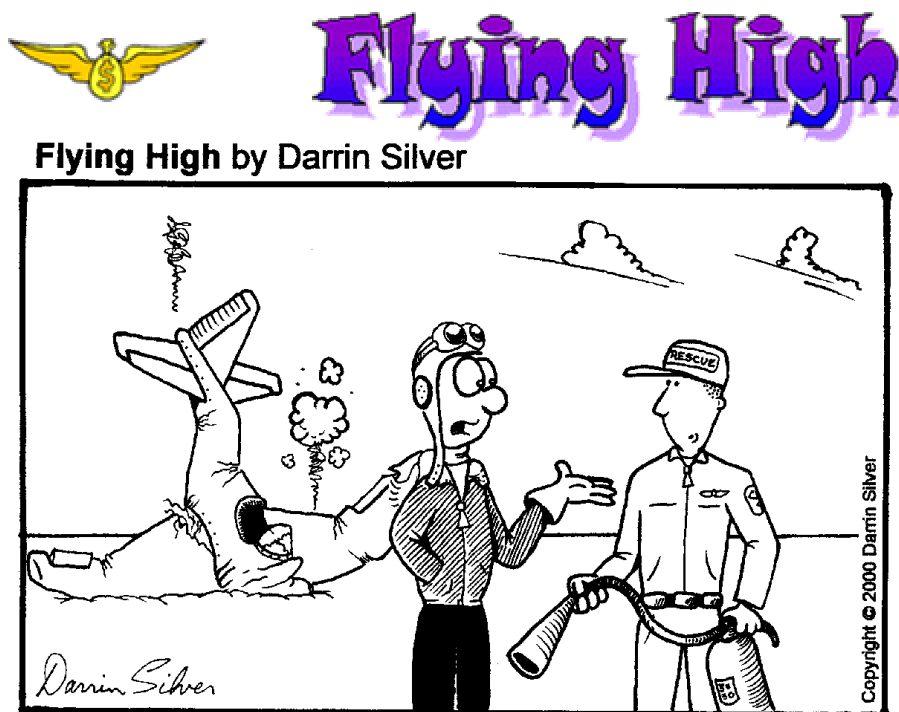
